Who are we thankful to?

- d. It matters who we're thankful to.
 - i. Where we direct thanks affects our behavior
 - ii. Luke 17:11-19: who should you thank?
- e. "Your faith has made you well" (v 19).
 - i. Not merely "healed" (cf. 17:17, 19:10)
 - ii. Indicator that the topic is the identity of Jesus (cf. 7:36ff, 8:40ff, 18:35ff)
- II. Thankful to Christ
 - a. Giving thanks to Christ changes our behavior
 - i. Moderation and generosity
 - ii. Scripture and Catechism at the dinner table

- b. Giving thanks to God in the flesh
 - i. Eucharist is from the Greek Εὐχαριστία "thanksgiving"
